

21-DAY DEVOTIONAL JOURNAL

Day 1: Recognizing God's Ownership

Psalm 24:1 "The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it."

As we embark on this journey of stewardship, let's start by acknowledging the foundational truth that everything belongs to God. Our time, talents, and resources are gifts from Him, entrusted to us for a purpose. Understanding that we are mere stewards allows us to approach our responsibilities with humility and gratitude.

Matthew 25:14-30 "For it will be like a man going on a journey, who called his servants and entrusted to them his property... To one he gave five talents, to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability."

In the context of Matthew 25:14-30, when Jesus talks about "talents," he is not referring to skills or abilities as we commonly understand the term today. Instead, a "talent" was a unit of weight or a measure of value in biblical times, particularly in ancient Greece and Rome.

In this parable, a talent was a significant amount of money, often estimated to be worth several years' wages for a laborer. So when the master in the parable gave his servants talents, he was entrusting them with a considerable sum of money to manage while he was away.

The parable illustrates the importance of using one's resources, whether they be financial or otherwise, wisely and productively in service to God and others, as exemplified by the faithful servants who invested and multiplied the talents they received.

Journal Prompt: Consider the financial means, resources, gifts, and abilities God ha	1S
blessed you with. Write down specific ways you can use them to serve others and	
advance His kingdom.	

Day 4: Investing Your Resources

1 Timothy 6:17-19 "As for the rich in this present age, charge them not to be haughty, nor to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly provides us with everything to enjoy. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share, thus storing up treasure for themselves as a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of that which is truly life."

Our financial resources are also entrusted to us by God. Whether we have much or little, we are called to be faithful stewards, using our resources to bless others and further God's kingdom agenda. Let's view our possessions as tools for God's work and be generous in sharing with those in need.

Journal Prompt: Reflect on your attitude towards money and possessions. In what

ways can you be more intentional about using your resources to honor God? Set specific financial goals that help will put you in a better position to serve God and others.	

Day 5: Prioritizing Kingdom Values

Matthew 6:19-21 "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

In a world consumed by materialism and self-gratification, it's easy to lose sight of eternal values. As stewards of God's resources, let's prioritize investing in things that have eternal significance. By focusing on building God's kingdom rather than our own earthly empires, we store up treasures in heaven that will never fade away.

Journal Prompt: Examine your current priorities and commitments. Are there any areas where you're investing more in temporal pursuits than in eternal ones? How

can you realign your priorities to reflect kingdom values?		

Day 6: Generosity in Action

2 Corinthians 9:6-8 "Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work."

Generosity is a hallmark of stewardship. As we give freely and cheerfully, we demonstrate our trust in God's provision and acknowledge His ownership over our resources. Let's cultivate a spirit of generosity, knowing that as we sow into God's kingdom, He blesses us abundantly to continue the cycle of giving.

Journal Prompt: Reflect on your giving habits. Are you giving generously and

I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do all this through him who gives me strength."

True contentment comes from Christ alone, not from our possessions or circumstances. As stewards, we are called to be content with what God has provided, trusting in His provision and sufficiency. Let's cultivate a spirit of contentment, knowing that our worth and satisfaction come from our relationship with Christ, not from worldly possessions.

Journal Prompt: Reflect on your level of contentment in life. Are there areas where

1 Peter 4:10-11 "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To him be the glory and the power forever and ever. Amen."
